Class days and times...

Speech Examinations and internal assessments...

Speech exams and internal assessments are just a few weeks away. Every student is preparing a programme of their work that will be assessed either externally by Speech NZ or internally by their teacher. Your teacher will advise you of your examination time as soon as this becomes available. Please be be aware of your child's programme they are expected to be prepping. Depending on their age and grade, this may include a poem recital, prepared reading, characterisation, prepared speech, and impromptu skills. You will find an outline of this in their speech and drama book. If you are not sure please contact your teacher early. There is an expectation that there will be some extra encouragement and support from home to get assessment programmes ready.



Visual aids to support prepared speeches...

Visual Aids are encouraged for supporting prepared speeches. A visual aid is a large poster (MUST BE A2 OR BIGGER) that a speaker uses to help their audience better understand their speech. A visual aid also acts as a support for the speaker to guide them through the contents of their speech. some tips for designing and using your visual aid

- · Use BIG BOLD keywords
- Use BIG BOLD images. Images convey so much more than words.
- STUDENTS MUST INTERACT WITH THEIR POSTER (e.g. turn to your poster, point to headings and images as you refer to them as you talk.
- Spend plenty of time practicing your speech with your visual aid.

Speech and Drama exercise books...

Please remember to send your child along to each lesson with their speech and drama book. Speech and Drama books are our our primary source of communication - bridging the gap between classes and home. In your child's speech and drama book you will see their work and their teachers feedback. You will also find information and notices about important dates and upcoming events. If you child needs a new or replacement speech and drama book please be sure to tell your child's teacher so we can get this arranged early in the start of term.
